I have pleasure in enclosing a First List of Subscriptions which have been kindly promised. It will be seen that a sum of about £70 has been promised in the course of ten days after sending out the first appeal.

I hope that this will encourage many others to come to the help of the Managers in preserving the old Schools of the Parish, and in averting the misfortune with which they are threatened.

During the course of the next ten days the Managers will have to definitely decide whether they will be able to carry out the improvements required.

Though the first response to our appeal has been so far satisfactory, yet

£130 is still required,

and I beg parishioners to come forward promptly with further help, so that the Foundation Managers may be encouraged to feel that they can rely upon the substantial support of the Parish in this important work.

Now that a considerable number of parishioners have so well shown the way, I trust that I may be favoured with promises of help from many more among the 260 houses in the parish from which there has been no response to our appeal.

I would point out that many of the subscriptions on the list are payable by instalments. We shall be pleased to accept help in the way most convenient to the giver—from subscriptions of 1d. a week for a year, upwards—and I sincerely trust that very many more among our parishioners will come forward to help to bring this effort to a successful conclusion.
