After the grass had been cut the first few broken bricks were removed from the engine house site. The pile will get bigger! The plan is to create a way into the engine house site so that when work on the Califat engine house has been completed there will be room for diggers to work on the Alabama engine house. An initial partial clearance of the site will enable LIHS to develop a plan for discussion with the Trust.





The Trust Management Committee supported their Technical Team in clearing the remains of the Newcomen boiler's former shelter, plus fencing the shaft to the same standard as the Coal Authority fence to the north.
